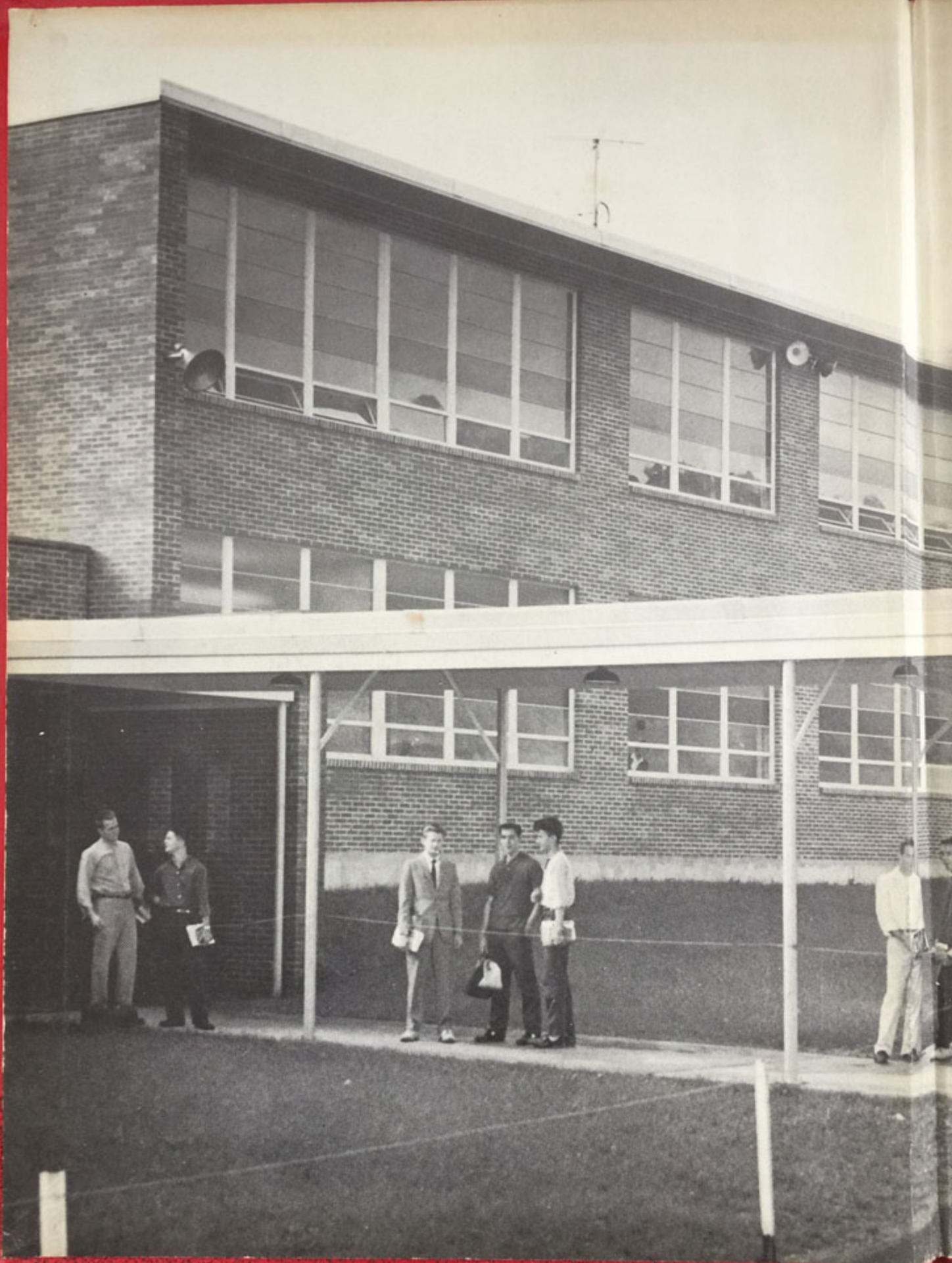

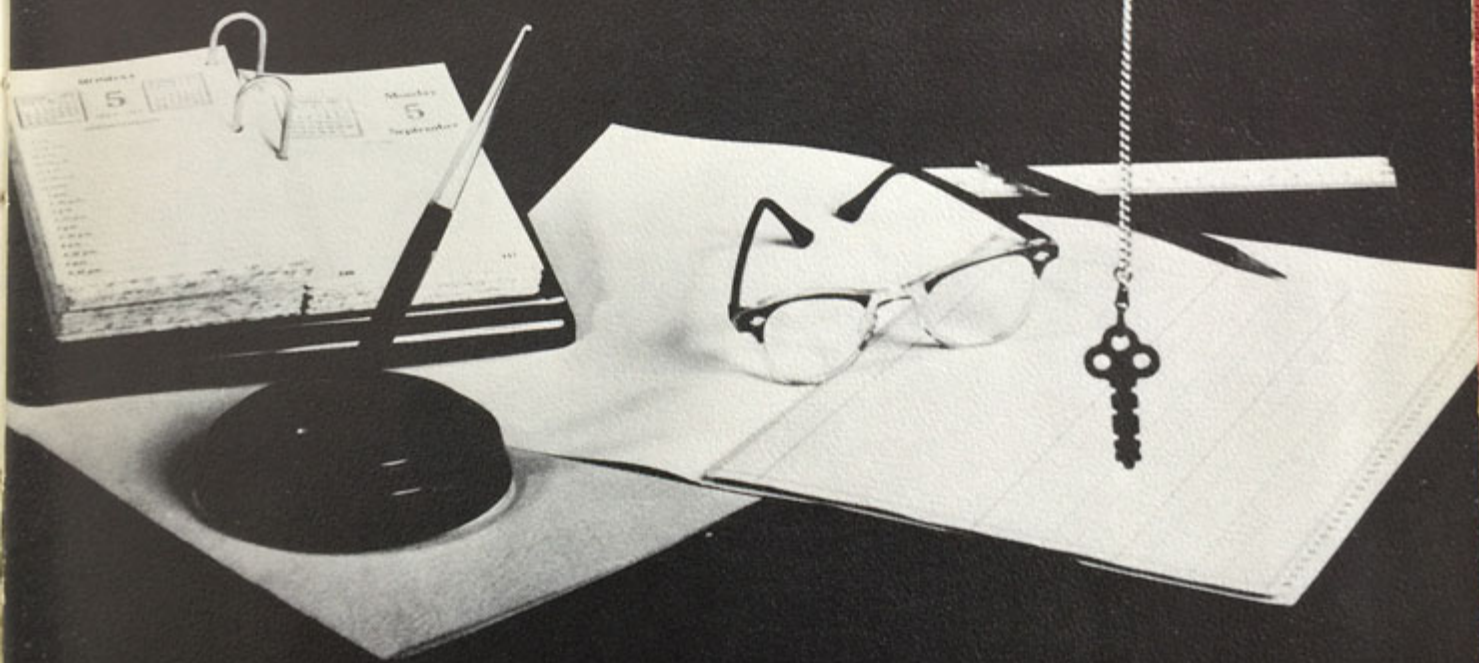

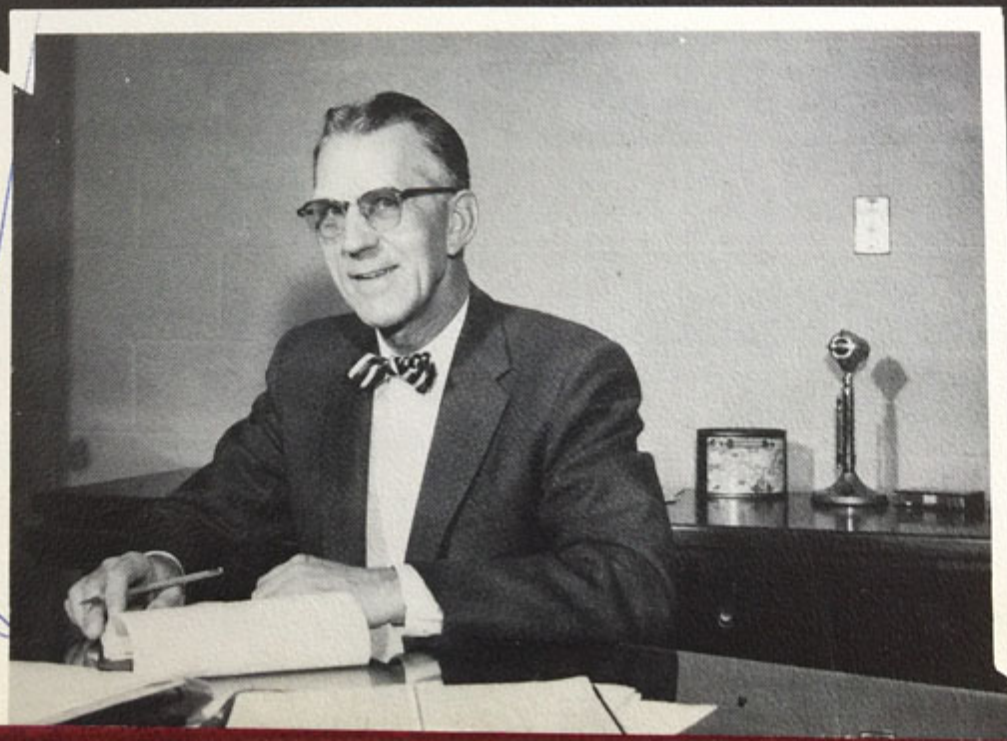

Blue Ridge Joint School Board

The Blue Ridge Joint School system had its official beginning on July 7, 1952 when the directors of the districts of Great Bend Borough, Great Bend Township, Hallstead Borough, Jackson Township, New Milford Borough, and New Milford Township, following a number of preliminary meetings, officially set their signatures and seals to a document which reads in part, "in consideration of the mutual advantages and benefits accruing to the respective school districts, it is agreed that each and every of the aforesaid school districts shall unite with each other to establish a joint public school."

The top of our school emblem, showing the rolling hills and the small twisting creek, represents the area between Hallstead and New Milford.

The left hand section of the picture is symbolic of the farms and agricultural work done in and around the townships of Jackson and New Milford.

The arrowhead depicts a time when the Indians inhabited this part of the country, mainly around the area now called Hallstead and Great Bend.

Our new junior-senior high school building marks the culmination of a period of prolonged planning, working, and endless effort on the part of the elected school directors representing the above-mentioned districts.
