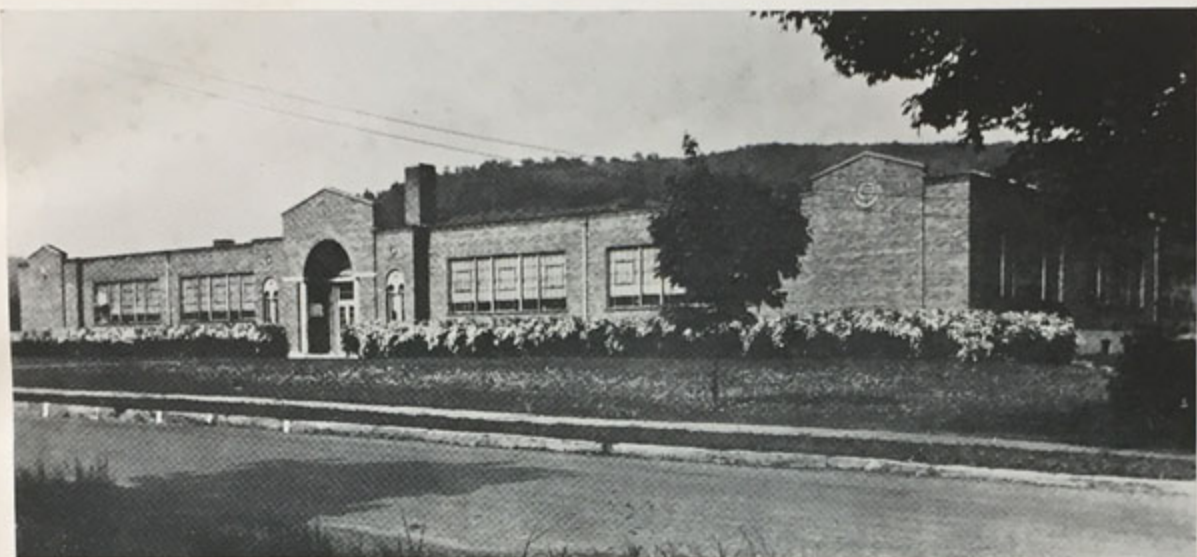

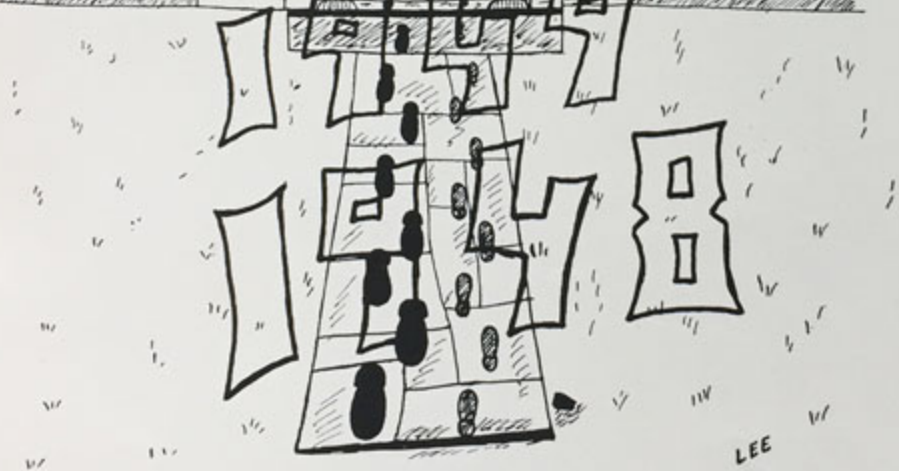

Hopes are bright for next year, for four of the regulars will be back to bolster our team next year.

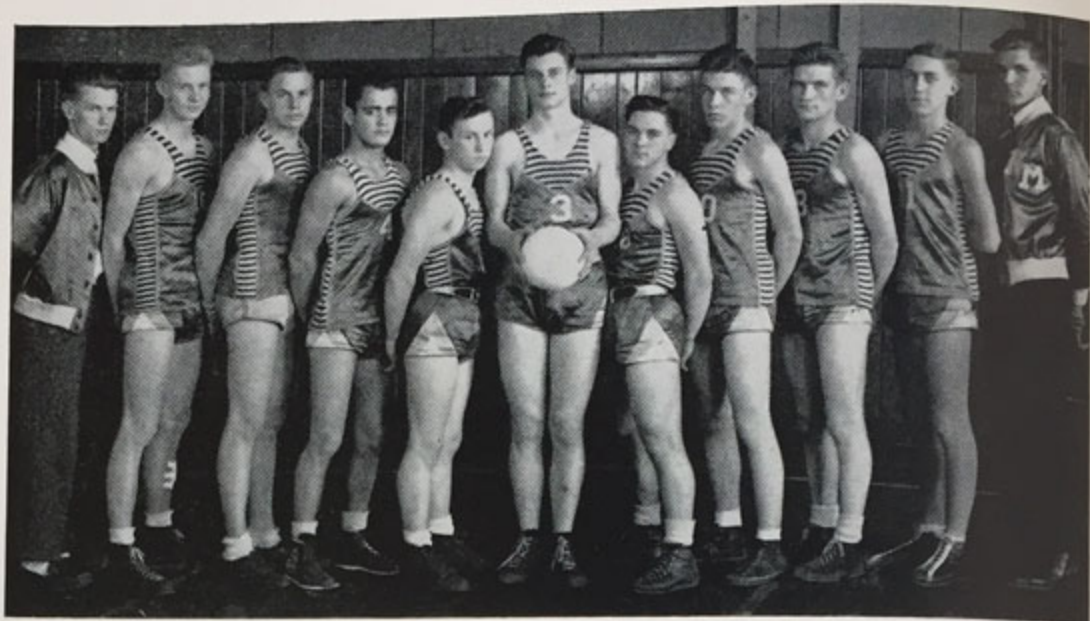
