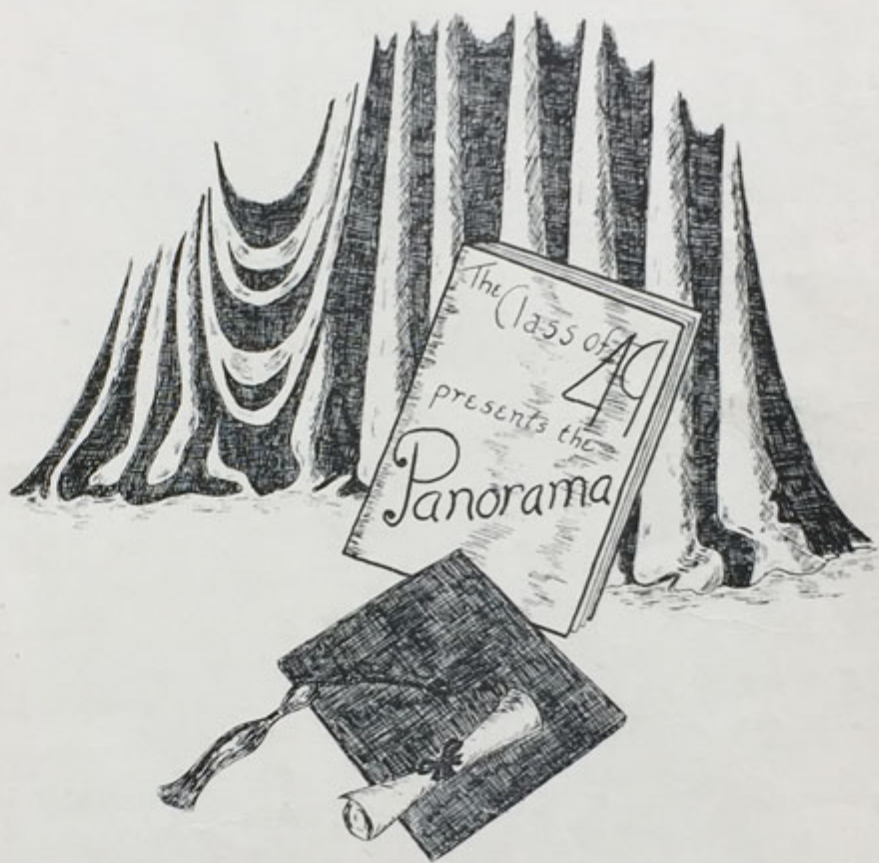

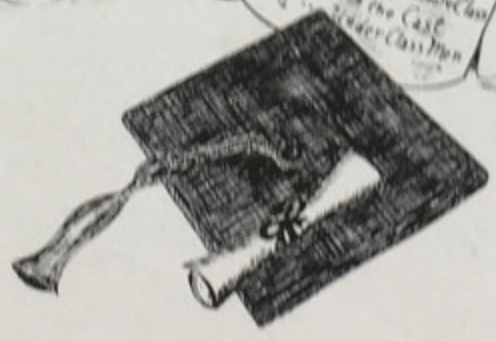
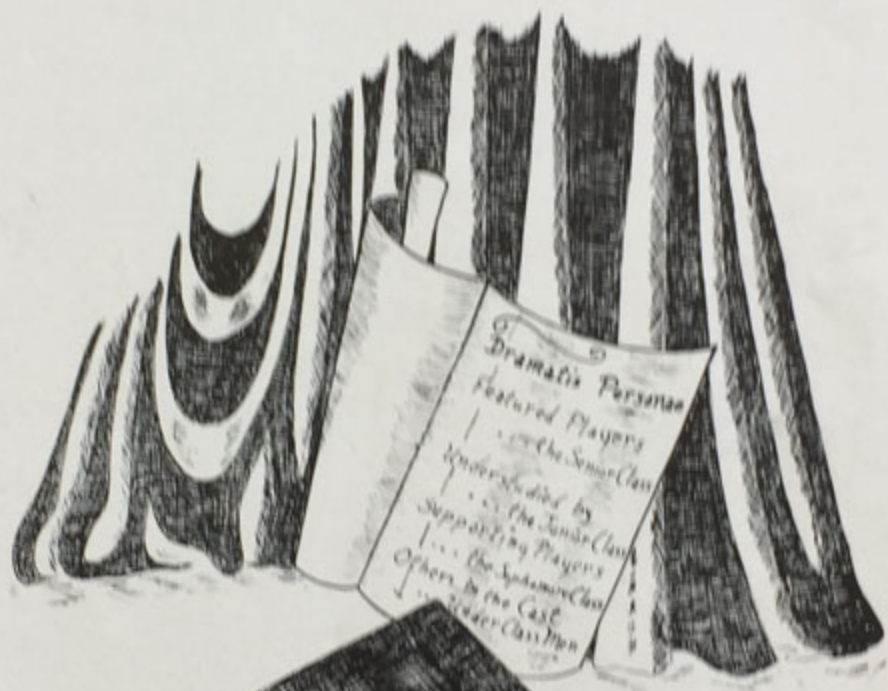

# Class History

Setting:

Time: September 1945—May 1949

Place: New Milford High School

## Act I

After a summer, much too short to suit them, fifty trees gathered again, at the school to be pruned. The boy trees were planted in the room-four-woods under the supervision of Botanist McAndrew, and the girl trees in the Home Economics Forests with tree-surgeon Brotzman as their overseer. This separation, due to the soil conservation laws grieved us greatly. Many new trees were planted among us this year. From the North Woods of Jackson came five saplings; Cyprus Aldrich, Dogwood Carpenter, Cottonwood Ropraz, Pussywillow Page, Mahogany Whitehead. From the woodlands of Franklin Hill came Redbud Armstrong, and Juniper Stockholm. From the lumber yards of Baltimore came Bamboo Armon. One day all the trees gathered in the library and elected as their officers: President, Chestnut Millard; Vice President, Walnut Fernane; Secretary, Cyprus Aldrich; Treasurer, Sister Elm Phillips. But, being sturdy, young trees, all quickly recovered including our instructor, Miss Hemlock Benning. For the grand finale of this year, the trees had a party in the Auditorium. Much to their disappointment, they had to leave at ten o'clock.

## Act III

Once more thirty-eight partially grown trees returned to the hall of knowledge, this time to be set out in the laboratory, with Miss Sassafras Hawley as their dictator.

and assistant Miss Hemlock Benning at her side with the whip. Officers were elected during the first week of school as follows: President, Sister Oak Tyler; Vice President, Bamboo Armon; Secretary, Sister Elm Phillips; Treasurer, Buckeye Haines. If you could have seen the trees in November, you would have had to shield your eyes from the glittering combination of gold and onyx. The trees were very proud of their class rings; the best the school had ever had. On November twenty-second, in celebration of Sassafras Hawley's birthday, the trees enjoyed a hot dog roast. In March, the trees rustled their leaves with joy at the thought of their Junior Play. After weeks of nightly rehearsals, they presented their play, "A Case of Springtime," under the direction of Botanist McAndrew and Sassafras Hawley. It was a huge success. But these trees were not held down by one success. They made further plans for their Annual Junior Prom, under the direction of Sassafras Hawley. This gave the trees a chance to return to their home in the woods for one week to gather ground pine to decorate the Auditorium, which, when finished, was a sight to behold. The Prom was held on May 17. All the trees blossomed out for the occasion. Sister Oak Tyler and Bamboo Armon were chosen king and queen of the prom. By this time, the trees were ready to take the much needed rest that the two months of Summer vacation meant.

#### Act IV

This year the trees were planted in the eighth grade room with Botanist McAndrew at their head once more. By now our number had decreased to a mere twenty-three. During the summer vacation four of the trees joined the service of their country. They were: Bamboo Armon, Hickory-nut Burchell, Walnut Fernane, and Brother Birch Phillips. The trees were glad to welcome two boys from the sugar plantations of Cuba for the first half of the year, Sugar Cane Castile and Sugar Beet Greck. Witch-hazel Cardno from the evergreen forests of New York City also joined them this year. They chose as their officers, President, Sister Oak Tyler; Vice-President, Chestnut Millard; Secretary, Magnolia Freeman; Treasurer, Buck Eye Haines. The Trees who by now were well experienced in the money making business, started out by selling candy. They held their first dance this year in October. This was the Harvest Ball. They then started rehearsing for the Senior Play, "We Shook The Family Tree," under the direction of Locust Llewellyn and Sycamore Daniels. This was presented on November 12, after which the trees, chaperoned by Sycamore Daniels, journeyed to the Barn in Binghamton to celebrate their huge success. Early in December, the trees were loaded in the back of Brother Palm Tyler's truck for a hayride to Middle Lake. On the fifteenth of December, eager to gain more knowledge the trees made a tour through I.B.M. and Ansco's in spite of the awful weather. On December 23, they went home for a well deserved Christmas vacation. On January 2, they returned and started work on the Year Book. On February 11, they held a Valentine Dance and raffled off a radio. By this time the tree strong box was increasing in weight so they decided to take a rest before the trying experience of graduating had begun. Graduation exercises were held on May 27 and on May 30 the trees left for the woodlands of Washington, D. C.
