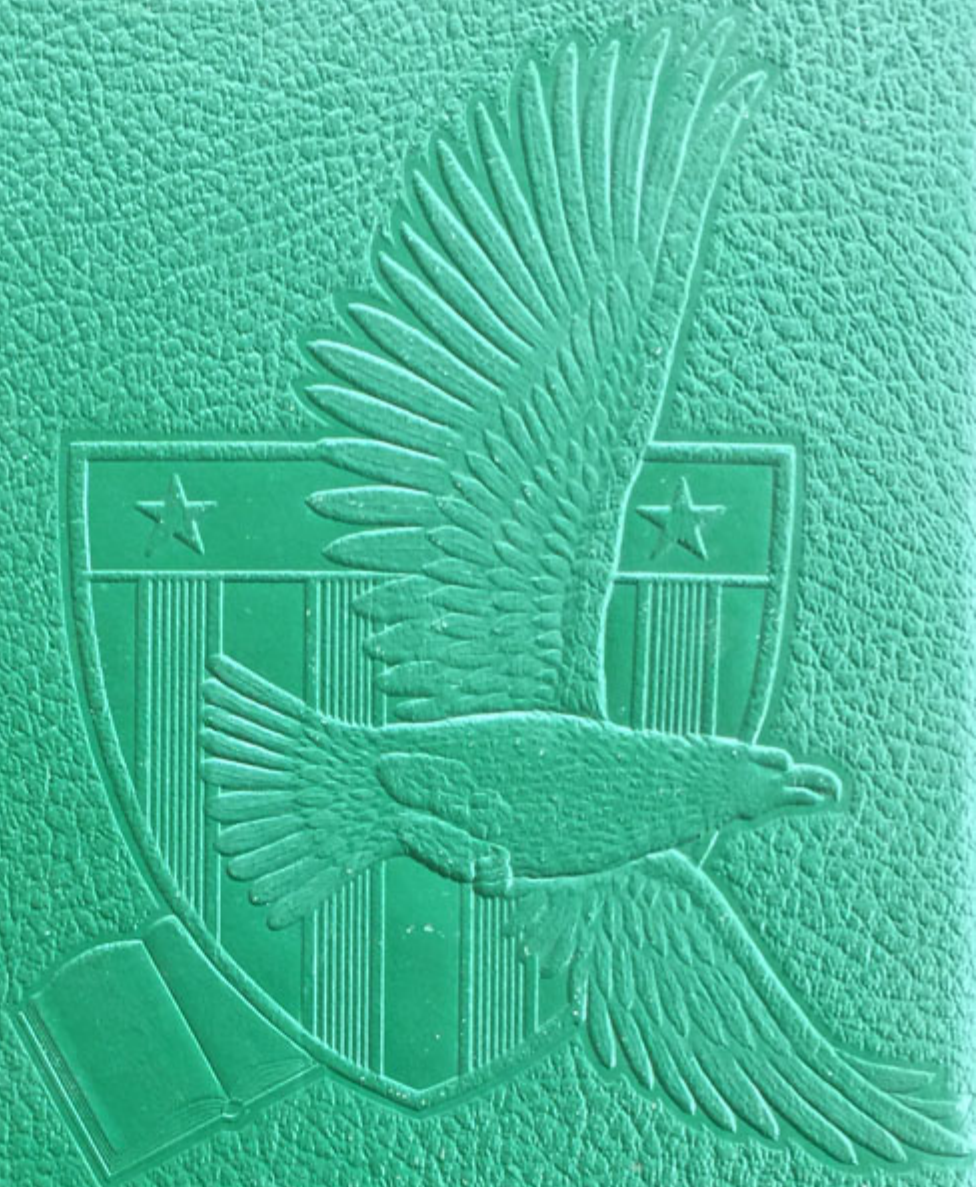

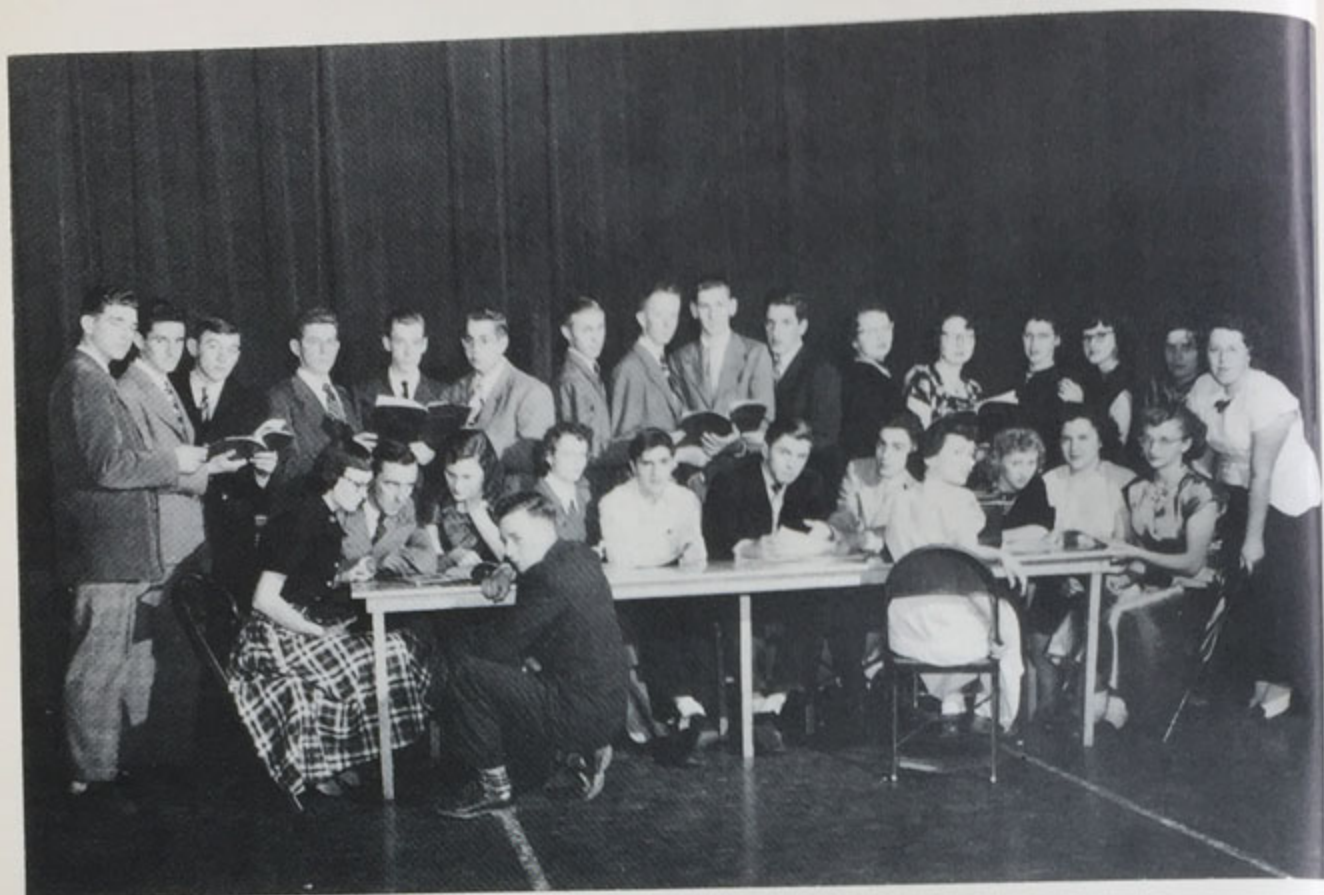

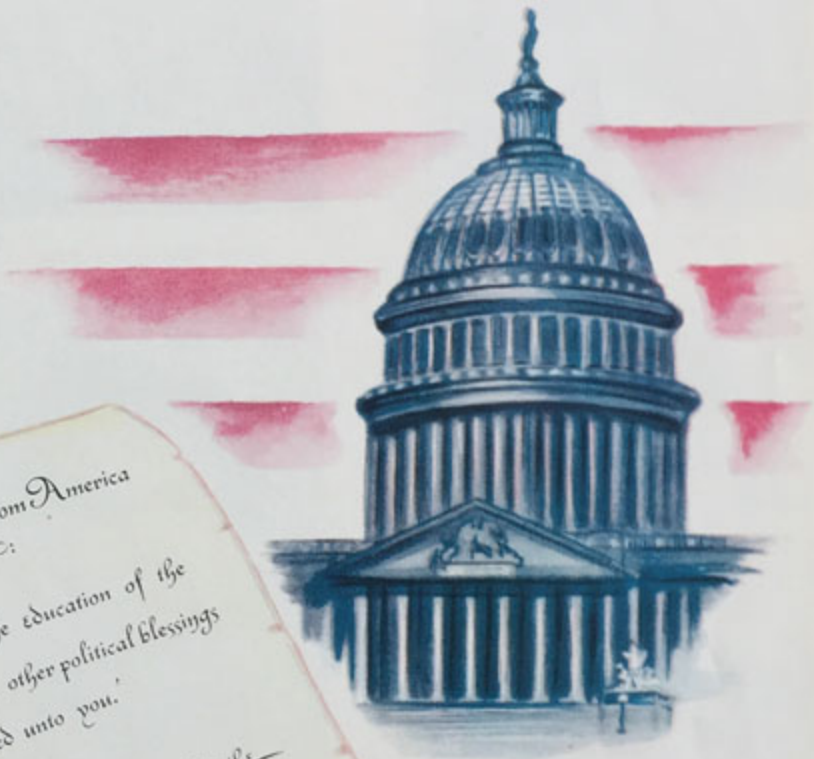

On October 19th, the class went to Binghamton to canvass the city for Yearbook ads. We sponsored "Record Dances" after home basketball games. Soon we will be leaving N. M. H. S. and our friends but we have these memories to look back to. We all consider it a good, well spent four years of high school.

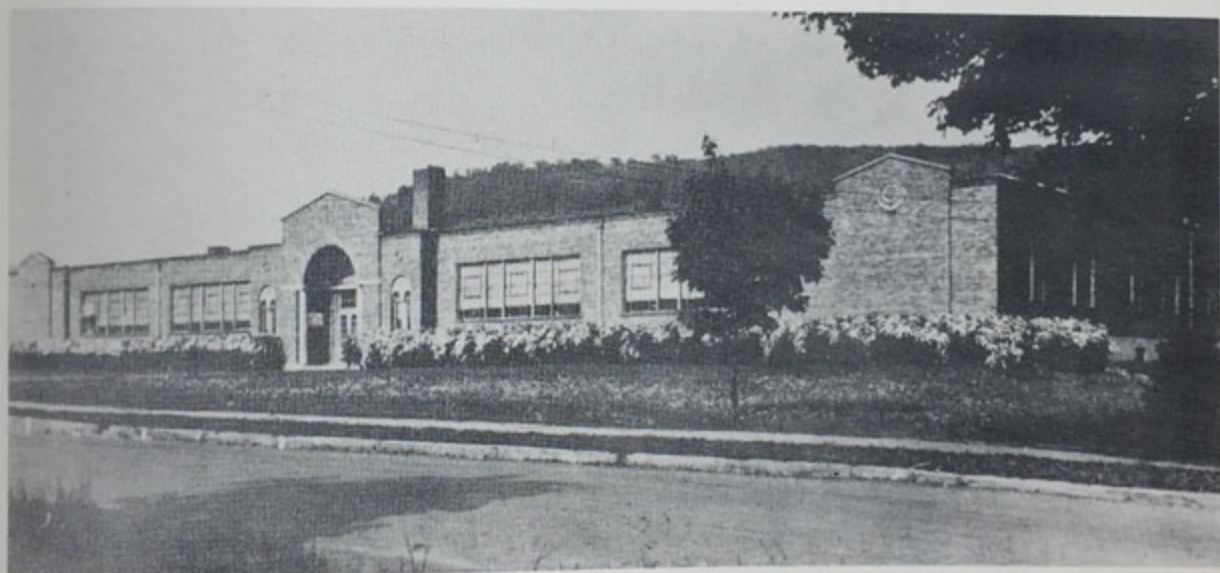
