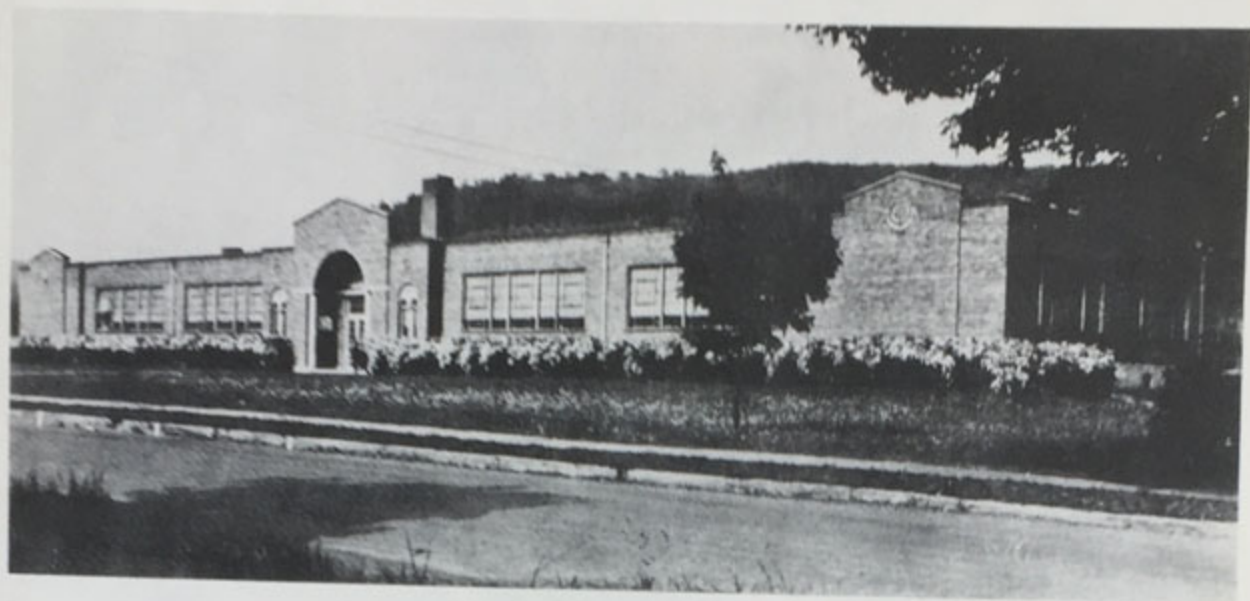

Hail New Milford High.

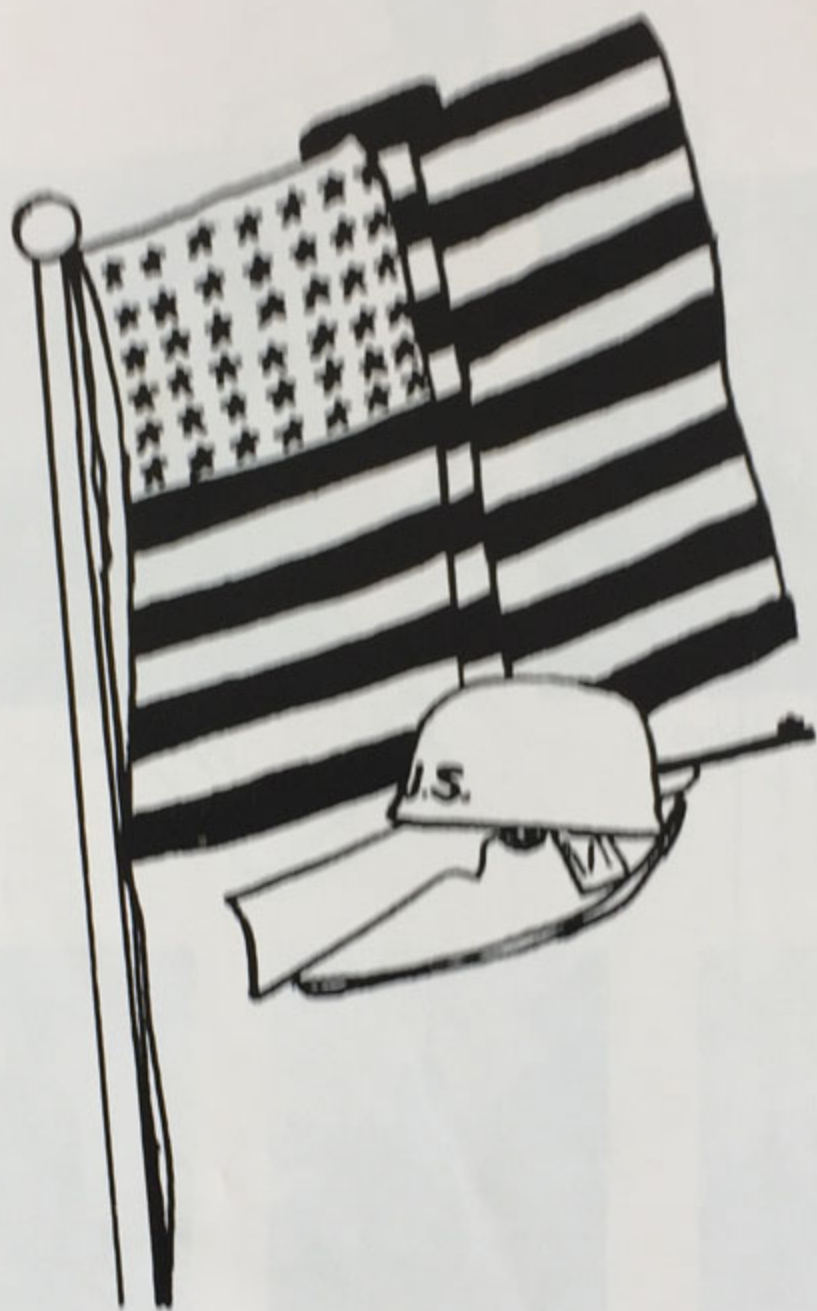
