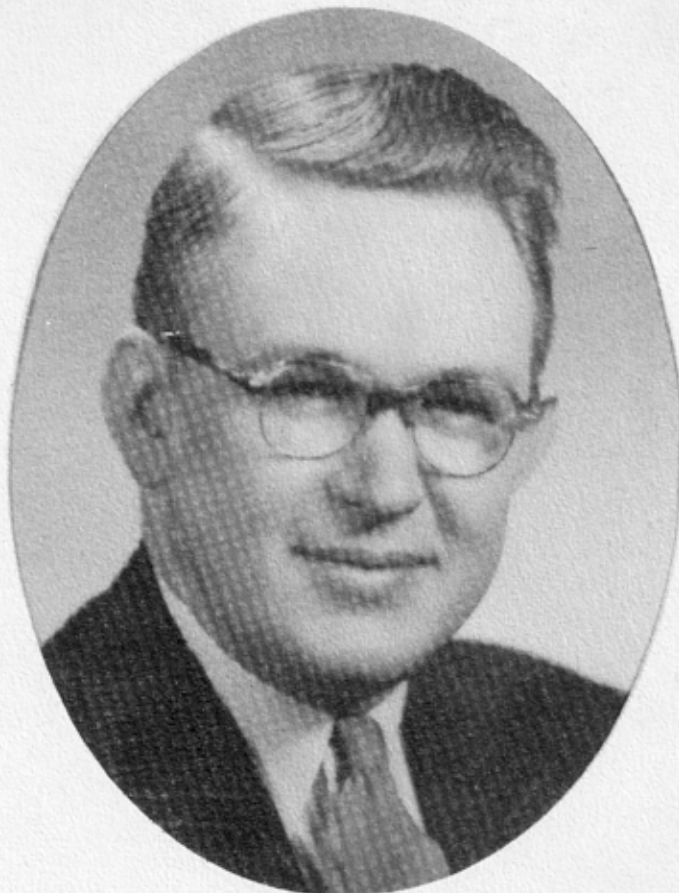

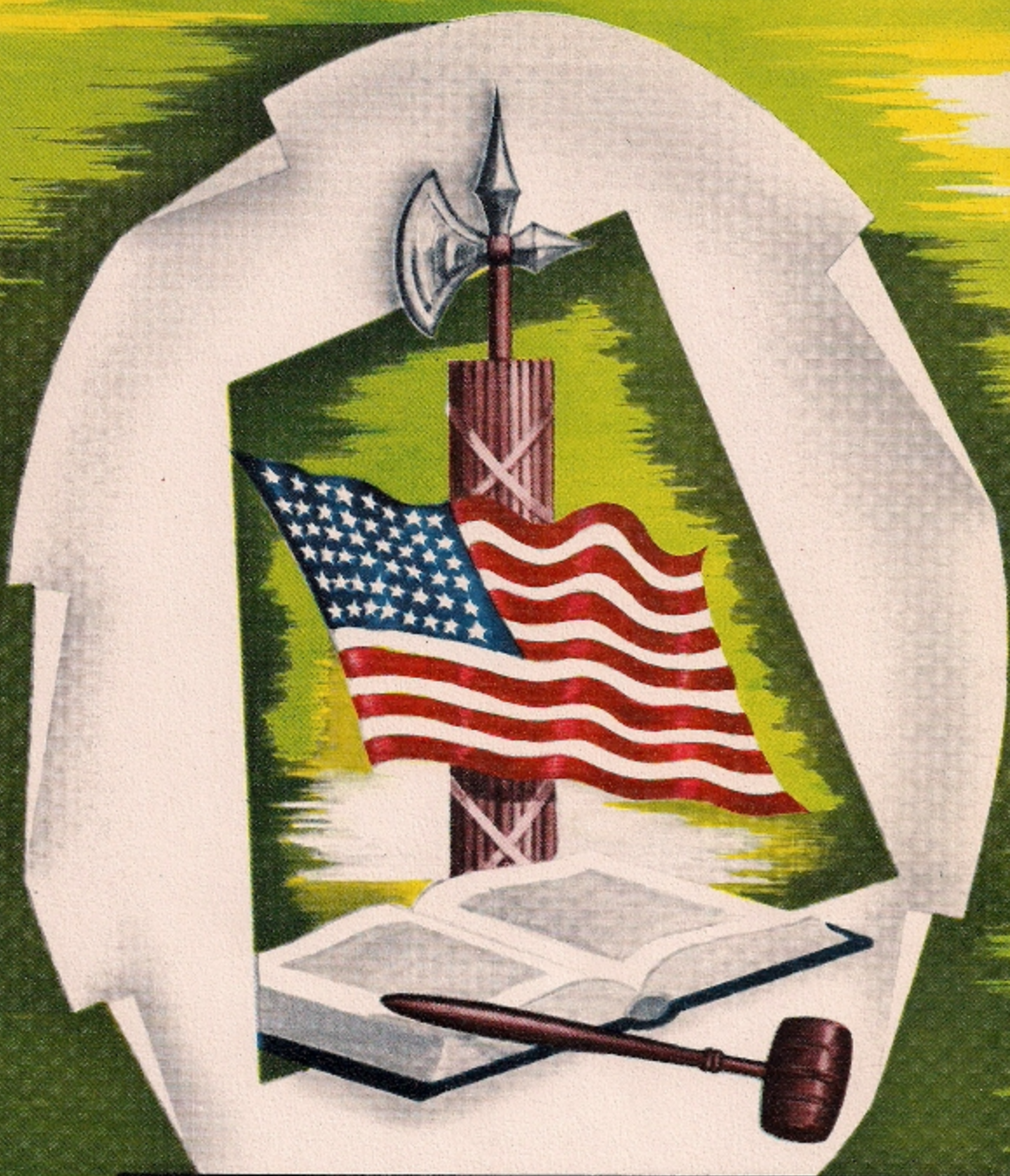

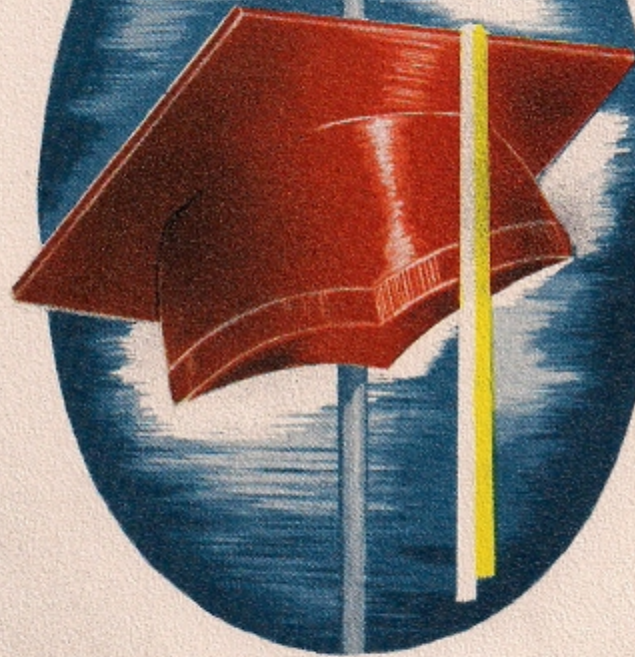

Class History

Back in 1940, just before Labor Day, the portals of New Milford School were opened wide to admit the old-timers and a brand new group of wide-eyed first graders. In the 12 years that followed, this group was exposed to the rigors of learning. They wrote, they read, they studied, they crammed, they assimilated as much knowledge as they could.

But, along with their book-learning, they had a lot of fun too. They played jokes on one another (and possibly on their teachers too.) They put on plays and went to dances and participated in sports. They shared experiences that will never be forgotten. They all had a memorable 12 years at New Milford School, but their education didn't end here. This was just the beginning. This was the time that prepared them for later years of study and work. These were the formative years that laid the groundwork for good citizenship.

A quick glimpse at the history of this "Illustrious Class of '52," as recorded by members of the class, reveals the following:

At the end of 12 years we have only 17 original members of our class with us. They are: Sara Alden, Carol Conklin, Anita Darrow, Joyce Decker, Odessa Empett, Donald Erat, Jean Flynn, Dorothy Munson, Theodore Plevinsky, Shirley Rice, Mabel Sauter, Betty Smith, Gordon Tilley, Jean Tyler, Carole Van Housen, Rosemary Whitney and Betty Wood. They belonged to the first grade of 1940-41 with Miss Bell (now Mrs. Hicks) as their teacher.

In the second grade, the twins, Jean and Joan LaBarre, came to join us from Harford. This year our teacher was Mrs. Hicks again.

Miss Hand was third-grade teacher. This year Delores Button from Harford, Kay Dodge from Baltimore, Maryland, Glenn Decker, Harriet McConnell and Peggy Wood were added to the class.

During our fourth year, Thelma Ostrom from Lawsville, and Shirley Stockholm from Franklin Hill joined us. Miss Tuttle was our teacher then.

In fifth grade, with Miss Conrad as our teacher, we had another addition, Howard Wilmarth of Jackson.

Sixth grade brought forth still others. In that year Bonnie Armstrong, Rolland Hawk, James Willson from Franklin Hill, and Thelma Houck from Connecticut, joined our growing group. Mrs. Erat taught the class that year.

Miss Benning (now Mrs. Stevens) kept our records in seventh grade. There were many changes in the membership again.

Eighth grade was quite a year because it brought us three more eager students and also our first male teacher, Mr. Rounds. The new students were: Robert Cramer from Hallstead, Stella Glinka from Franklin Hill, and Ronald Smith from Massachusetts.

When we entered our first year of high school we had nine Jacksonites join us -- Suzanne Bell, Carleton Brown, Richard Carpenter, Lillian Harvey, Patricia Kane, Bill Lee, Richard Rambo, Josephine Staerker and Dorothy Wilmarth. Lyle Bennett came from Harford. Our class officers this year were: Richard Rambo, President; Glenn Decker, Vice-President; Gordon Tilley, Secretary; Delores Button, Treasurer. Our homeroom teacher was Mr. Daniels. Our Freshman year ended with a rollicking trip to Rocky Glen.

We spent tenth grade under the supervision of Mrs. Kingsley. This was the year we organized a court to try the cases of those who were caught throwing papers around or running in the halls. As a result the halls looked much cleaner. During the Sophomore year Eleanor March came to us from West Chester, but we lost three: Harriet McConnell, Richard Rambo, and Lyle Bennett. Our class officers were: Suzanne Bell, President; Gordon Tilley, Vice-President, Betty Wood, Secretary; Thelma Houck, Treasurer.

We were in the Laboratory for our Junior year, with Mr. Wilson as our advisor. Our class officers were: President, Carole Van Housen; Vice-President, Donald Erat; Secretary, Bonnie Armstrong; Treasurer, Shirley Stockholm. High-lites of the year: We chose our class rings September 23 and couldn't wait to receive them. Gordon Tilley was elected Assistant Editor for the Yearbook. We canvassed the town to sell stationery and came back to the school for a party. We sponsored the Doc Williams show. Our class play, "Our Miss Brooks," was chosen, and was rehearsed under the direction of Miss Veras and Mr. Rounds. Then before we knew it, it was time to have the long-awaited Junior Prom, which we called "Cinderella Ball", with music by Dick Naylor and his Orchestra.

After an all-too-short summer vacation, the school bell called us back to our last and most exciting year. As Seniors we elected our class officers: President, Lillian Harvey; Vice-President, Bonnie Armstrong; Secretary, Eleanor March; and Treasurer, Rosemary Whitney. Mr. Phoebus was our class advisor. Our first big success of the year was our senior play, "The Minx from Missouri", directed by Mrs. Kingsley. We sold candy during our noon hours and decided that we were good salesmen. We sponsored the annual Harvest Ball with Jimmy Welch's Orchestra. We canvassed Binghamton, New Milford, and surrounding areas for ads for the yearbook. We had our pictures taken for the yearbook on January 23 and then worked hard on the book to meet our deadline.

After Baccalureate, Class Night and Graduation we plan to spend our last days together "seeing the sights" in our capital, Washington, D.C.
